

Livelihood Program



Dipti Foundation supports sustainable livelihoods that improve income, nutrition, and resilience. Our focus includes solar irrigation, homestead gardening, and poultry & livestock.

1. Solar Irrigation: DF introduces solar-powered irrigation systems for poor farmers. This reduces dependency on costly fuels and protects the environment. It ensures year-round crop production and food security. Farmers gain higher yields and steady incomes.

2. Homestead Gardening: Families receive seeds, training, and tools to grow vegetables at home. Gardening improves nutrition, especially for women and children. Excess produce provides an additional source of income. This practice builds self-reliance and food sustainability.



3. Poultry & Livestock: DF trains families in poultry and livestock rearing. Proper vaccination and care improve animal health and productivity. Women actively participate, increasing their household income. This initiative creates long-term stability for poor families.

Disability Inclusion Program

Dipti Foundation always prioritizes the inclusion of persons with disabilities in all project activities, ensuring their rights and empowering them in livelihoods. This reflects the spirit of the SDG goal "No One Left Behind."

Through its programs, DF promotes equal access to education, health, and income opportunities for persons with disabilities. The foundation focuses on skill development, vocational training, and linking individuals with social safety nets to reduce inequality. Awareness campaigns address stigma, while special attention is given to women and children with disabilities for protection and empowerment.

By mainstreaming disability issues into development, building partnerships, and promoting accessibility, Dipti Foundation works to create an inclusive society where every person, regardless of ability, can live with dignity and hope.

Who We Are

Deepti Foundation (DF) is a non-political, non-profit, non-governmental organization that works not only for poverty alleviation and empowerment of marginalized communities, but also for the promotion of human rights, education, health education and good governance and rule of law in the society through the provision of resources. Rev. Salman Sowpan Boss started this organization through the 1998 flood response project. Since 2018, it has been restructuring its 'General Organization and Executive Board' and reforming its strategy. The foundation of this voluntary, charitable, relief and development organization was in Dhaka; whenever the country was affected by any natural disaster, DF stood by the affected poor people to save their lives and livelihoods. What we do

Economic development

Dipti Foundation works to reduce poverty by creating diverse income opportunities. Our economic programs focus on microcredit, job creation, handloom, and youth skill development.

1. Microcredit: Through small loans, DF **700** enables poor families to start or expand income-generating activities. Microcredit helps women and marginalized groups achieve financial independence. It promotes a culture of savings and self-reliance in disadvantaged communities. This initiative restores livelihoods, especially during post-disaster recovery.

2. Job Creation: DF supports entrepreneurship and small business development for sustainable employment. Skill training and enterprise loans help beneficiaries secure jobs or create their own. Special focus is given to women and youth to increase their role in the economy. Job creation initiatives uplift families from extreme poverty with dignity.

a. Handlooms: DF has been able to revive traditional crafts through handloom projects, in addition to generating income for over **100** poor families. DF provides training, raw materials, and market linkages to weavers. This initiative allows women to work from home and contribute to family income.

b. Youth Vocational Training: DF has provided vocational and technical training to more than **20** youth to acquire employable skills. Training covers trades like tailoring, electronics, and computer operations. These programs prepare youth for both local jobs and overseas employment. By engaging youth in productive work, DF helps reduce unemployment and poverty.



Health-program

Deepti Foundation focuses on hygiene, eye care, and sanitation for underprivileged communities through awareness, prevention, and essential services.

1. Hygiene: DF organizes awareness sessions on hand washing, safe water and personal hygiene. Hygiene kits including masks, soap and sanitizers have been distributed to over **500** people in emergency situations like COVID-19. Poor families are encouraged to maintain healthy daily habits to prevent diseases. This program especially protects children and mothers from health risks.

2. Eye Camps: Over **150** people have already been provided with free check-ups, treatment and minor surgeries through free eye camps. Poor patients are provided with medicines and spectacles for improved vision and eye health. DF's eye camps reduce preventable blindness in rural and slum areas. This initiative restores the productivity and dignity of vulnerable people.

3. Water & Sanitation: DF promotes safe latrines and clean water access to reduce waterborne diseases. Families are trained on waste management and hygienic practices. Sanitation initiatives improve living conditions in slums and rural communities. These efforts protect children from frequent illness and keep families healthier.



Disaster Management Program

Dipti Foundation strengthens community resilience through humanitarian response, disaster risk reduction, and climate change adaptation. Our focus is to protect lives, restore livelihoods, and build safer communities.

1. Humanitarian Response: During floods, cyclones, fires and epidemics, DF has provided relief to **600** families in emergency situations. Families have been provided with food, hygiene kits and household essentials during times of crisis. By taking rapid action, vulnerable people have been ensured to cope with sudden shocks. This program saves lives and restores hope among ordinary people in disaster-stricken areas.

2. Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR): Community volunteers are trained in rescue, first aid, and preparedness. Risk assessments (CRA) help families plan against local hazards. DF integrates DRR into all projects as a cross-cutting theme. These efforts reduce vulnerability and enhance community safety.

3. Climate Change Adaptation (CCA): DF supports climate-smart farming, irrigation, and homestead gardening. Awareness programs prepare families for floods, droughts, and cold waves. Communities adopt eco-friendly practices to protect the environment. CCA initiatives ensure long-term resilience for vulnerable households.



Children & Women Program



1. Child "Safe Home" for Trafficking Children: House of Hope started its journey in Bangladesh in 2017 to rescue and rehabilitate trafficked and distressed girls. Currently, **20** girls live in this shelter, who are receiving care, protection and education. The program rescues girls who have been victims of abuse, trafficking, abandonment and violence. Each child receives counseling to overcome trauma and rebuild trust. Academic education and home-schooling prepare them for mainstream school. Their skill development training includes sewing, handicrafts, beautification and cooking. Girls are given opportunities for cultural practices. Birthdays, trips and family care create a family environment. This shelter instills love, discipline, respect and family values. Through rehabilitation and skills training, girls are empowered for a dignified future.



2. Child Education (Pre-School): DF is running 4 pre-school programs for underprivileged children with **100** children. Early education of children ensures cognitive, social and emotional development. Pre-schools prepare children for mainstream schooling with confidence. This initiative breaks the cycle of poverty through education.
